

Destination Zero is an initiative that aims to reduce the number of suicides in Fond du Lac County to ZERO by promoting collaboration across sectors (clinical providers, area employers, veteran service groups, education, and service agencies) to ensure that policies and procedures are in place across the county which lead to better care for those at risk of suicide.

In the last 7 months over 600 people have attended a QPR training in Fond du Lac County! QPR is a suicide prevention training in which participants learn how to recognize the signs of mental distress, ask simple and direct questions, and help those in need to access local resources. Thanks to the generous donation of time by local Certified QPR Instructors and Destination Zero grant funds, this training is offered at no cost – both by request for any agency or group in Fond du Lac County, and at monthly sessions held at the Fond du Lac Family YMCA.
